

# NSW GOVERNMENT CODE OF PRACTICE FOR PROCUREMENT

## LOG OF REVISIONS

### **ORIGINAL VERSION OF CODE: COMMENCED 1 JULY 2004**

Applies to procurements for which tenders closed up to and including 31 January 2005.

### **REVISION 1: 18 JANUARY 2005**

Applies to procurements for which tenders close on or after 1 February 2005.

#### **Introduction**

Include that the standards of behaviour established by the Code are expected also from tenderers and service providers

Include that service providers are also to consistently apply the Code's standards of behaviour.

Re-introduce the pre-existing Implementation Guidelines.

Provide for revisions to the Code.

#### **5.1 Best Practice**

Include industrial relations as an area where best practice may be demonstrated.

Include that a head service provider is accountable to the client agency for all other service providers down the contract chain.

#### **5.2 Tendering Requirements**

Revise from who tenders will not be accepted.

Evaluation Criteria - Include "ability to meet Code requirements" as a typical critical factor.

Evaluation of Tenders - Clarify that alternative tenders must comply with the Code.

#### **Appendix A**

Environmental Management - Include reference to Procurement Manual guidelines.

OHS Management and Workplace Injury Management - Include reference to Procurement Manual guidelines.

Workplace Practices and Industrial Relations – Obligations Relating to Employment: Clarify accountability of principal contractors.

Workplace Practices and Industrial Relations – Site Allowances: Remove the reference to arbitration and the explanation of site allowances.

Security of Payment – Include this new section.

Employment and Outwork Obligations for Textile, Clothing and Footwear Suppliers –  
Refer to further obligations detailed in the Implementation Guidelines.

Clarify which version of the Code is to apply to tenders.

Update CACC and SCCB contact details.
